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### **TEC Collection Development Policy**

The Teacher Education Center, located on the first floor of Benner Library, is a unique collection of pre-K through Grade 8 materials that supports teacher education programs at Olivet Nazarene University. The Teacher Education Center provides education students with resources to help prepare them for their future career as teachers. The TEC collection includes picture books (Easy), fiction and non-fiction books, elementary and middle-level textbooks and supporting materials in all subject areas.

### I. Circulation Polices

TEC materials circulate for a 4-week period and are eligible for renewals up to sixteen weeks. Some curriculum materials check out for 2 weeks with one renewal.

Textbooks are only available for use in the library.

### II. Collection

### **Collection Formats**

Easy Books- Fiction picture books

Juvenile Fiction- Includes chapter books for elementary, middle grades, and YA readers.

Juvenile Dewey- Children and YA books that are not Easy or Fiction. This section includes informational books, fairytales/folklore, poetry, and more.

Textbooks and Curriculum-The TEC has a collection of textbooks and curriculum materials that all subject areas for pre-k through 8th grade. The sections are organized by content area (see appendix A.

Classroom Manipulatives – Materials to enhance teaching and instruction in the classroom, including models, games, and manipulatives.

### **Diversity**

Resources that emphasize diversity and multiculturalism are intentionally included in the collection.

### **Academics Standards**

Resources are chosen to align with the Illinois Learning Standards and other standards across the pk-8 grade levels.

### Children's Book Search

The purpose of the book search is to help students find children's book about a specific topic easily. Books are added to the children's book search based on topic or class. See the library catalog for the comprehensive collection.

### III. Selection Process

Materials are selected based on merit and gaps in the collection. Some controversial materials are incorporated in the collection to encourage students to analyze issues and make scholarly judgments. The Teacher Education Center prioritizes the collection of award winning and notable materials. The Education librarian has the responsibility of selecting materials for the collection. The library director makes the final decision regarding selection.

### **Patron Recommendations**

Selection of materials accommodates library patron requests, but the TEC is not obligated to purchase patron recommendations. Purchases are subject to availability of funds and to collection standards. ### V. Collection Evaluation

### Weeding

Materials are withdrawn from the TEC collection when it is deemed no longer appropriate for the TEC and/or one of the following criteria is met: condition, format, relevance, authority, content, and duplicates.

### Replacements

Replacement of lost, damaged, outdated material with a newer copy, The Education librarian is responsible for examining the teacher education center collection to determine if repair/replacement is desired. If materials are damaged, they may go to technical services for repairs. If materials are beyond repair and replacement is necessary, the Education librarian will recommend replacement of the item.

### **Gifts**

Gifts are added to collection if they meet the selection process criteria.
